- Offers vaccines to children, teens, and adults, no matter where you live.
- Provides routine tuberculosis (TB) screening.



SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAM

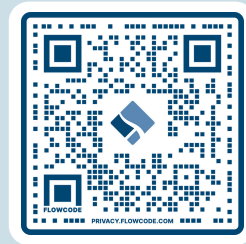
- Offers Arlington Public Schools (APS) students first aid/emergency care in school clinics, hearing and vision screenings, and health information.
- Offers free vaccines you need to attend APS schools. Contact your school nurse to get vaccinated at school or call 703-228-7444.
- Explains health requirements that you need to complete to enroll in APS.

PARENT & INFANT EDUCATION (PIE) PROGRAM

Helps families with young children (0–3 years) who have developmental delays or medical conditions that impact typical learning and growth.

- Provides physical, occupational, speech, developmental therapy, and mental health services
- Part of the Infant Toddler Connection of Virginia (early intervention)



WOMEN, INFANTS, & CHILDREN (WIC) PROGRAM

Helps improve the health of pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, as well as infants and children under 5 years with:

- Free food, nutrition advice, and education
- Breastfeeding support and electric breast pump loans
- Immunization checks
- Health and social services referrals

Fathers, foster parents, and legal guardians can apply for children under 5 years.

SEXUAL HEALTH SERVICES

These services are provided in the same clinic. You are welcome no matter where you live. All gender identities welcome.

- Birth control, including free condoms
- Emergency contraception
- Pregnancy testing
- STI testing and treatment

FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES

Offers services for teens and women who can have children:

- Well-woman exams
- Pap smears/cervical cancer screening
- Mammogram referrals

Offers preconception counseling and services.

TEEN HEALTH SERVICES

Offers services for teens (13–19 years) including sexual health education and counseling.

SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS (STIs)

Tests, treats, and educates on STIs, including mpox and HIV. Provides referrals as needed.

OTHER PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Helps prevent and control diseases that spread from person to person, or through air, water, food, soil, insects, or animals.

- Investigates outbreaks where many people in one place get the same illness at the same time
- Provides information to help slow or stop the spread of germs

ANIMAL BITES

Investigates bites from pets or wild animals to figure out the risk for rabies and what to do next.

RODENT CONTROL

Educates on rodent problems, such as how to clean up, remove food sources, and get rid of rodent shelters. Property owners must handle pest control on their property.

CAR SEAT CLINIC



Offers child car safety classes. Arlington residents who attend and qualify based on income get a free car seat or booster for children 0–8 years.
